Kiwanis Education by Cyndi Anderson

During the months of March, April and May 2010, your Kiwanis Board of Directors and interested Club members participated in a three-part Strategic Planning process.

Howard Hansen (a former Kiwanis member) volunteered to lead the group in a strategic planning exercise designed to help us focus on our mission, identify areas for future growth and development, and identify key strategies that are important to the strength and vitality of our Kiwanis organization. Everyone who participated in the process found it to be valuable and productive and we thank Howard for his tremendous effort on behalf of Kiwanis.

The program for our May 11th Kiwanis meeting was a summary of the key strategic areas and goals that were developed as a result of this work. Cyndi Anderson presented a summary of the process and outcomes, noting that there is still work to be done on developing the tasks to accomplish the strategic objectives. Here is a brief overview of the strategic goals for Kiwanis over the next one to two years:

Strategic Area: Membership

Goals:

- Recruit one new member a month (minimum) each year
- Retain 95+% of current members each year
- Conduct 5th Tuesday Socials on an ongoing basis
- Conduct Fall and Spring Member Orientation sessions

Strategic Area: Financial

Goals:

- Maintain favorable operating margin
- Conduct one major fundraising event on an annual basis, generating a net of \$15,000
- Conduct periodic long range planning for major gifts
- Generate and utilize a consistent funding application request form

Strategic Area: Program

Goal:

- Create a brief “introduction” format for the introduction of program guests each week

Strategic Area: Service Projects

- Identify a minimum of four service projects to be done on an annual basis by the Club.
